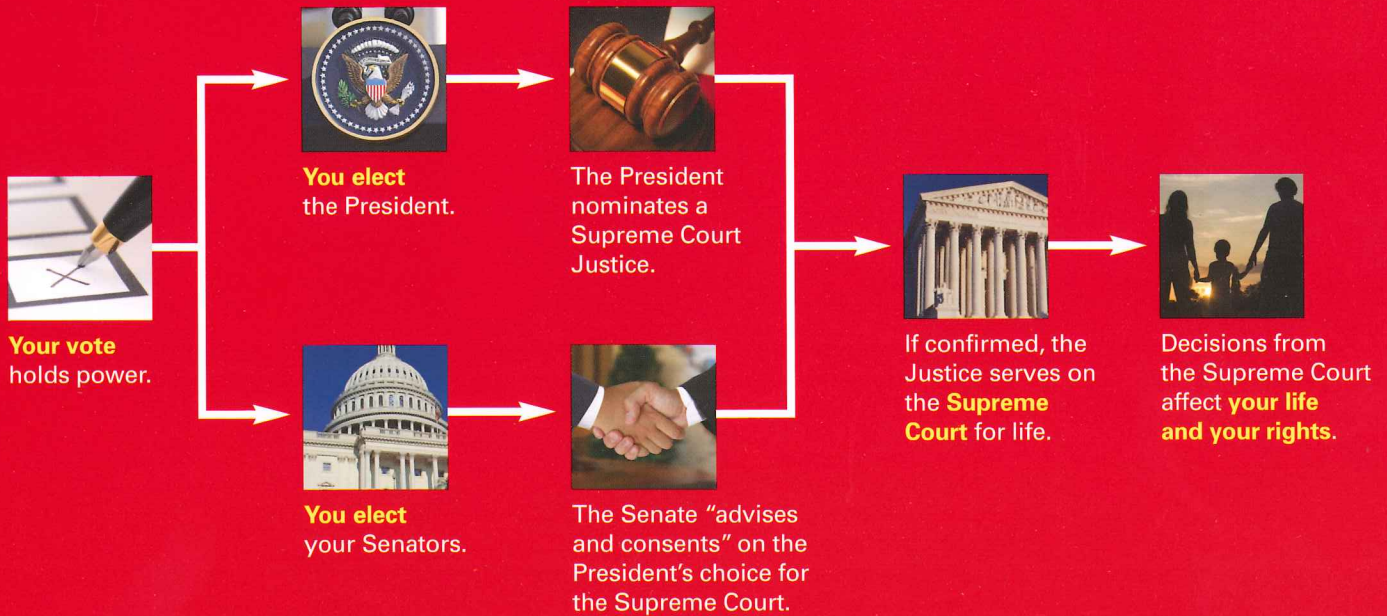


Your vote determines who sits on the Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court has allowed states to require restrictive voter ID laws. In the 2004 election, 12 Catholic nuns were denied from casting their votes because they didn't have drivers' licenses.
